Larry

You and I met on July 21 to discuss this matter. The thrust of your request was to:

- Change the term of the lease from an annual, self-renewing term to a 10 year term
- The revised agreement would allow for County provision of any engine comparable to the current 772 versus a specific engine emphasis was placed on comparable pumping capacity
- The purpose was to provide greater certainty on the future availability of a County engine with a minimum pumping capacity
- Being able to ensure that capacity would assist the District in its long-term fleet planning for both budgetary and ISO rating reasons

In discussing this with Chief White, we cannot in good conscious support such a long-term commitment. The engine is an important and valuable County asset and simply cannot be guaranteed for dedicated use for such an extended time. Having said that, we have no plans or intentions of cancelling the lease and retrieving the County engine from the District.

To be clear, this decision was reached prior to and independently of my email sent earlier this morning related to placing 772 on ROSS and its unapproved use on a State fire.

I was very surprised to receive this email from Supervisor Royce. In your email below to Evan with Cc to your Board members, you express disappointment in my "resistance" to meet with you regarding the agreement between the County and District. Attached is the collective email string between you and my Executive Assistant Christina Cunha on this matter. This demonstrates that my office's communications have been timely, professional and positive.

In preparing for the meeting, I re-read: 1) your stated reason for the meeting - "I'd like to talk about the Agreement regarding E-772 and possibly extending that agreement"; and 2) the language in the agreement related to term. Since the agreement automatically renews unless otherwise terminated by either party, I asked Christina to call and make sure that you knew that and if that addressed your concern, to ask if we still needed to meet. You expressed to Christina that there was something more that you wanted to talk about and she immediately confirmed that we would keep the meeting. Part of the reason I was asking is that I am actively engaged in activities related to the Detwiler Fire that has been running through Mariposa County (impacting our neighbors who we have been supporting in several ways) and is currently threatening to cross into populated areas of Tuolumne County. If the meeting was not necessary, that would have saved me time to focus for my County OES duties. Having said that, unless my duties related to the Detwiler Fire require me to be elsewhere, I still intend to keep our appointment.

Nevertheless, I am responding to you in writing with copy to your Board members to clarify that there has never been any "resistance" to meet with you.

Christina set up a meeting Friday; however, now I am getting resistance from Mr. Pedro who states that he doesn't see anything in the Agreement that needs modifying. For our planning purposes here at the Fire District we are very interested in modifying the agreement to set longer terms (it is currently a year-by-year agreement, which limits our strategic planning ability) and additional reassurances that will facilitate our ability to make longer term plans.

I really prefer to review this with Mr. Pedro face-to-face and not over the telephone or via email. I'm hopeful that he will continue with the meeting that we have scheduled on Friday, but I am somewhat disappointed at his resistance before I even have an opportunity to express what we'd like to see done with the Agreement.

This item will be discussed at the Regular Board Meeting next week (it is a public meeting if you would like to attend).

The most critical concern that we have at this time is that we are being charged rent AND expected to maintain the property; that is inapposite to the existing agreement where we maintain the property in exchange for \$0.00 rent. As you know if you've seen the property, it is well maintained, free of flammable vegetation and cleaned of debris and garbage on a regular basis.

We would like to continue the existing agreement; however if that is not possible; we are greatly concerned about the probability of future bark beetle tree mortality. If I read the proposed agreement correctly, we would be responsible for removing dead and dying trees. Frankly, this District does not have the financial capacity to absorb those costs. If Cal Trans can amend the agreement so that it is clear that dead trees will be removed by Cal Trans, then we can probably see our way clear to signing this amended agreement. To date, Cal Trans has taken out trees killed by the bark beetle, which we greatly appreciate. Also, this District paid to have a very large pine tree removed about 3 years ago because it was threatening to fall on the sleeping area of our fire station.

With respect to third-party claims against Lessee(s), Lessee(s) waives any and all rights to any type of express or implied indemnity against Department, its officers or employees, except where claims, suits or actions arise out of the sole negligence or willful misconduct against Department, its officers or employees.

It is the intent of the parties that Lessee(s) will indemnify, defend and hold harmless the Department, its officers and employees from any and all claims, suits or actions as set forth above regardless of the existence or degree of fault or negligence on the part of Department, Lessee(s), the officers or employees of either of these, other than the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the Department, its officers and employees.

Nothing in this lease is intended to create the public or any member thereof a third-party beneficiary hereunder, nor is any term or condition or other provision of the lease intended to establish a standard of care owed to the public or any member thereof, except as expressly provided by law.

Said policies shall name Department as an additional insured and shall inure to the contingent liabilities, if any, of Department and the officers, agents and employees of Department and shall obligate the insurance carriers to notify Department, in writing, not less than thirty (30) days prior to the cancellation thereof, or any other change affecting the coverage of the policies. 25) HAZARDOUS MATERIALS: Hazardous materials are those substances listed in California Code of Regulations, Title 22, Section 66261.126, Appendix X, or those which meet the toxicity, reactivity, corrosivity or flammability criteria of Title 22 of the above Code, as well as any other substance which poses a hazard to health or environment.

Except as otherwise permitted in this lease, Lessee(s) shall not use, create, store or allow any such substances on the premises. Fuel stored in a motor vehicle for the exclusive use in such vehicle is excepted.

Breach of any of these covenants, terms, and conditions shall give Department authority to immediately terminate this lease. It is the intent of the parties hereto that Lessee(s) shall be responsible for and bear the entire cost of removal and disposal of hazardous materials or waste introduced to the premises during Lessee's period of use and possession as owner, operator or Lessee(s) of the property. Lessee(s) shall also be responsible for any cleanup and decontamination on or off the leased premises necessitated by such materials or waste.

Lessee(s) shall further hold the State, and any officer or employee, harmless from all responsibility, liability and claim for damages resulting from the presence or use of hazardous materials on the premises during Lessee's period of use and possession.

26) WATER POLLUTION CONTROL: Lessee shall not allow discharge of contaminated storm water runoff or unauthorized non-storm water discharges to private or public storm water drainage systems. Additional BMPs may be obtained from the Right-of-Way Property Management and Airspace Storm Water Guidance Manual (RW Storm Water Manual) available for review the Department's District Right of Way office at: http://www.dot.ca.gov/hq/row/rwstormwater. In the event of conflict between the attached Fact Sheet(s) and this Lease, this Lease shall control.

Lessee shall provide Department with the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) code applicable to Lessee's facilities and activities on the lease premises. A list of regulated SIC codes may be found at the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB)'s Web site: http://www.waterboards.ca.gov/water_issues/programs/stormwater/sic.shtml. Other SIC codes may be found at: http://www.osha.gov/pls/imis/sicsearch.html.

Department, or its agents or contractors, shall at all times have the right to go upon and inspect the premises and the operations conducted thereon to assure compliance with the requirements herein stated. This inspection may include taking samples of substances and materials present for testing, and/or testing of sewer systems, storm drains, or watercourses on the premises.

27) GENERAL INDUSTRIAL PERMIT: For any activities conducted on the lease premises listed in Attachment 1 to General Permit Order 97-03-DWQ (General Industrial Permit) issued by the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB), Lessee shall develop, implement and maintain a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) covering those activities. Information on the General Industrial Permit is electronically available at the SWRCB Web site: http://www.waterboards.ca.gov/water_issues/programs/stormwater/gen_indus.shtml#indus. Lessee will address storm water and water quality protection by implementing appropriate best management practices (BMPs) described in the SWPPP. A copy of the SWPPP, including any updates, will be provided to the Department and also maintained on the lease premises.

Lessee shall also provide a copy of the following: Notice of Intent (NOI) or No Exposure Certification (NEC) filed with the SWRCB; Receipt Letter from SWRCB showing Waste Discharge Identification (WDID) Number; and Notice of Termination (NOT), if applicable. Lessee is solely responsible for compliance with the General Industrial Permit.

- 28) WAIVER: If any part of this Lease is invalid by reason of law or governmental regulation, or if any provisions hereof are waived by Department, the remaining portions of this Lease shall remain in full force and effect. Department's receipt of rent with the knowledge of any breach of a provision of this Lease shall not constitute a waiver of such breach.
- 29) AMENDMENTS: The terms of the lease may be, in writing, amended, revised, altered, or changed, by mutual consent of the parties hereto upon thirty (30) days' written notice. Any amendment, revision, alteration, or change shall operate with the same force and effect as the original agreement.

Agricultural

Irrigation

The irrigation system should be inspected and tested (or observed while in operation) to verify proper operation multiple times annually. Two of these inspections should occur during or immediately following wet weather. Any leaks, broken spray heads, or other malfunctions with the irrigation system should be repaired immediately.

Repair broken water lines as soon as possible. Shut off the water source to isolate a broken line, sprinkler or valve as soon as possible to minimize the loss of water. Protect downstream storm water drainage systems and watercourses from water pumped or bailed from trenches excavated to repair water lines.

Manage irrigation systems to ensure the appropriate amount of water is used and runoff is minimized. Irrigate slowly or pulse irrigate so the infiltration rate of the soil is not exceeded. Inspect irrigation enters sould be for the last the last

not exceeded. Inspect irrigation system regularly for teaks to ensure that excessive runoff is not occurring. If re-claimed water is used for irrigation, ensure that there is no runoff from the landscaped area(s). Use automatic timers to minimize runoff.



Fertilizer



Read the product label and follow the directions carefully, using only as directed. Avoid applying near driveways or gutters. Never apply fertilizer before a rain. Store fertilizers and chemicals in a covered area and in sealed, waterproof containers. Use non-toxic products whenever possible.

Do not locate fertilizer stockpiles in areas of concentrated flows of storm water, drainage systems, inlets or watercourses. Do not locate fertilizer stockpiles adjacent to sensitive water bodies. Divert storm water run-on away from stockpiles. Implement wind erosion control practices on stockpile material.

Minor slides/slipouts usually occur during major storms. Stockpiles should be removed as soon as practicable and materials should be placed so that waterways are not impacted. During rain events, cover fertilizer stockpiles. Repair and/or replace covers as necessary to keep them functioning property.

Pesticides

Apply pesticides in compliance with federal, state and local pesticide use regulations. Apply pesticides only as specified on the Pesticide Use Recommendation and the label. Activities should be approved by a licensed Agricultural Pest Control Adviser.

Effective pest control through chemical application requires consideration of the following:

- Use of the correct pesticide
- Seasonal timing of applications
- Timing in relation to expected precipitation events
- Proximity to water bodies
- Speed of travel when applying pesticide
- Proper agitation of the spray tank

Minimize the use of pesticides in or near storm water drainage systems or watercourses. Calibrate the spray rig to ensure accurate application of pesticides. Avoid using overhead irrigation for as long as the chemical manufacturer recommends after applying pesticides. Do not spray chemicals when rainfall-causing runoff is forecast within 12 hours.

Stormwater Pollution Prevention

Soil Erosion

Remember the cardinal rule for reducing erosion: keep the land covered! Plant crops that protect the soil. A good conservation cropping sequence contains a high percentage of crops that are soil hugging, produce heavy canopy cover, and produce large amounts of after-harvest residue. Do not grow crops producing low residue more than one year in a row. Use crops that provide protective cover during normal high erosion periods.

Use crop residue management (any tillage system leaving 30 percent of the soil surface covered with crop residue after planting) to protect the soil not covered by a growing crop.

Use conservation tillage systems such as no-till and mulch till to plant crops while maintaining crop residue on the soil surface. No-till uses a one-pass drill with openers that places seed and fertilizer in narrow bands without disturbing the area and residue between the drill rows. Mulch tillage uses equipment that disturbs the full soil surface but does not invert the soil or bury excessive amounts of crop residue.

Shape the sides of waterways and plant grass to provide protection from erosion. Vegetative filter strips are strips of grass or other close growing vegetation that slow water runoff and trap sediment and other solid materials. Plant filter strips in areas where water will pass over them as sheet flow.

Mulch the soil surface with off-site residue or other organic material to protect soil when vegetative or residue cover is not available Mulches improve water intake, absorb the impact of falling raindrops, and trap water to slow its movement. Straw mulching is becoming a readily accepted way to reduce irrigation-induced erosion in furrow-irrigated fields.

Livestock

Use dry cleaning methods to clean animal handling areas regularly. Sweeping animal handling areas is encouraged over other methods. Properly dispose of droppings, uneaten food, and other potential contaminants.

If water is used for cleaning:

- Do not discharge wash water to storm water drains or other receiving waters.
- Wash water should be collected and pumped to the sanitary sewer, do not allow wash water to enter storm drains. DO NOT discharge wash water to sanitary sewer until contacting the local sewer authority to find out if pretreatment is required.
- Keep animals in paved and covered areas, if feasible. If keeping animals in covered areas is not feasible, cover the ground with vegetation or some other type of ground cover such as mulch. Prevent animals from moving away from controlled areas where BMPs are in use (e.g. fencing, leashing, etc.).
- Non-storm water discharges to drainage paths, drain systems and watercourses are prohibited.
- Use dry cleanup techniques (e.g., vacuuming, sweeping, dry rags) to remove solid waste from the site when practicable. Use another technique only when dry cleanup techniques are not practicable, such as having to wet for dust control for safety or air quality reasons. Recycle, reuse or properly dispose of solid waste.
- Prevent storm water run-on from contacting stored solid waste through the use of ditches, berms, dikes and swales. Locate solid waste storage areas away from drainage facilities and watercourses and areas prone to flooding or ponding. Periodically inspect the solid waste storage areas and review the disposal procedures. Repair or replace damaged or missing BMPs.

Farm Equipment

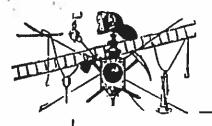
Conduct regular cleaning. Sweeping or vacuuming the storage facility is encouraged over wet cleaning methods. Sweep all storage lots at least once before the onset of the wet season. Establish frequency of sweeping based on usage and field observations of sediment accumulation.

Washing or rinsing of equipment shall be performed in designated areas (describe what a designated area should be) and the resulting runoff shall not be discharged to the storm drain system.

Train employees on appropriate BMPs, storm water discharge prohibitions, and wastewaler discharge requirements.

The District plans to construct a building, to house fire engines, and utilize the existing structure for offices and quarters, including a training/multiple purpose room.

LEASE AGREEMENT

THIS LEASE, made this 20th day of February, 2002, in Stockton, California, by and between the State of California, Department of Transportation, Lessor, and MI WUK - SUGAR PINE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, Lessee, of P.O. Box 530, Mi-Wuk Village, California, 95346-0530.

WITNESSETH

- 1) DESCRIPTION: The Lessor, in consideration of the payment of the rent hereinafter specified to be paid by the Lessee, and the covenants and agreements herein contained, does hereby lease, demise, and let unto Lessee that certain property in the County of Tuolumne, State of California, the address of which is located in back of 24247 Highway 108, Sugar Pine, CA (APN 047-060-23), and legally described as: Outlined in yellow on attached map, and including the following improvements:
 - A portion of the improvements which extend into the States' right of way. The improvements are primarily used for storage.
- 2) TERM: This lease shall be for a term of five (5) years, commencing on the 1st day of March, 2002, and ending on the 28th day of February, 2007, with the right of cancellation and termination in both Lessor and Lessee as hereinafter set forth.
- 3) RENT: No rent is to be paid in exchange for maintenance of property.
- SECURITY DEPOSIT: Tenant shall deposit with the Department \$0.00 as a guarantee for faithful performance of the conditions of this Agreement. Department may use such amounts as are reasonably necessary to remedy Tenant's default in the payment of rent to repair damages caused by Tenant, or by a guest or a licensee of the Tenant, to clean the premises, if necessary, upon termination of tenancy, and to replace or return personal property or appurtenances exclusive of ordinary wear and tear. If used toward rent or damages during the term of tenancy, Tenant agrees to reinstate said total security deposit upon five days written notice delivered to Tenant in person or by mail. No later than two weeks after the Tenant has vacated the premises, the Department shall furnish the Tenant with an itemized written statement of the basis for, and the amount of, any security received and the disposition of the security and shall return any remaining portion of the security to the Tenant.
- 5) UTILITIES: Lessee shall pay when due all water, electric, gas, and other lighting, heating and power, rents and charges accruing or payable in connection with said property during the term of this lease.
- 6) USE:
 - a) Lessee shall use the property for the following purposes only: Parking and storage of firefighting equipment and incidental use of improvements sited in Clause 1 of this lease.

- NOTICES: All notices herein provided to be given, or which may be given, by either party to the other, shall be deemed to have been fully given when served personally, or when made in writing and mailed addressed as follows: To the Lessee at the address above stated and to Lessor c/o Department of Transportation at PO Box 2048, Stockton, CA 95201-2048, Attn. R/W Property Management. The address to which the notices shall be mailed to either party shall be changed by written notice by either party to the other, but nothing herein shall preclude the giving of notice by personal service. Lessor shall also be able to serve notices by posting and subsequent mailing to Lessee.
- 10) CONDITION AND REPAIRS: Lessee shall not call on Lessor to make any improvements or repairs on the property, but Lessee hereby specifically covenants and agrees to keep the property including furnishings and equipment, if applicable, in good order and condition at Lessee's cost and expense.
- 11) ASSIGNMENT AND SUBLETTING: Lessee shall not assign or sublet this lease without the written consent of the Lessor.

- 16) FIRE INSURANCE: Lessor will not keep the property insured against fire or any other insurable risk, and Lessee will make no claim of any nature against Lessor by reason of any damage to Lessee's property in the event it is damaged or destroyed by fire or by any other cause.
- 17) PREVIOUS AGREEMENTS: In the event there is any existing lease or rental agreement between Lessee and Lessor (or its predecessor in interest) covering the property, it is agreed and understood that this lease shall cancel and terminate said prior lease or rental agreement as of the effective date of this lease.
- 18) RELOCATION PAYMENT: Lessee acknowledges the following: Lessee occupied the premises after Lessor acquired title for a public project. Lessee may be required to vacate the premises to allow construction of the public project, and Lessee is not entitled to receive any payments under either the State or the Federal Uniform Relocation Assistance Act. (Gov. Code, Section 7260, et seq.; 42 U.S.C., Section 4601, et seq.)
- 19) POSSESSORY INTEREST: The Lessee's interest is subject to a possessory interest tax (tax) that may be imposed by the City or County. However, the Lessor is required to pay any such tax directly to the City or County on behalf of the Lessee. The amount of rent charged the Lessee reflects the cost of this added responsibility to the Lessor.

Tax bills inadvertently received by the Lessee should be forwarded to the Lessor for payment.

NON-LIABILITY OF LESSOR: Nothing in the provisions of this lease agreement is intended to create duties or obligations to or rights in third parties not parties to this lease agreement or affect the legal liability of either party to the lease agreement by imposing any standard of care respecting the duties and obligations under this lease agreement different from the standard of care imposed by law.

It is understood and agreed that this Lease Agreement is made upon the express condition that State of California and any officer or employee thereof is to be free from all responsibility, liability, claims, suits or actions of every name, kind and description, brought for or on account of injury to any person or persons, including Lessee, or to property of any kind whatsoever and to whomsoever belonging, including Lessee, occurring on or about the premises or from any cause or causes resulting from the operations and/or use of the premises, or the sidewalks adjacent thereto, by Lessee, his agents, customers, business invitees and/or any persons acting on Lessee's behalf. It is also understood and agreed that Lessee shall defend, indemnify and save harmless State of California, all officers and employees thereof, from all liability, claims, suits, or actions of every name, kind and description brought for or on account of injuries to or death of any person or damage to property arising from any aforesaid cause or causes during the term of this lease agreement.

Lessee waives any and all rights to any type of express and implied indemnity against State of California, its officers or employees.

It is the intent of the parties that Lessee will indemnify and hold harmless State of California, its officers or employees from any and all claims, suits, or actions as set forth above regardless of the existence or degree of fault, whether active or passive, primary or secondary, on the part of State of California, other than its sole negligence.

21) LIABILITY AND PROPERTY DAMAGE INSURANCE: Lessee shall, at Lessee's expense, take out and keep in force during the within tenancy:

General liability insurance providing coverage in the amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence for Bodily Injury and Property Liability combined, in a company or companies to be approved by the Lessor, to protect Lessor, its officers, agents and employees against all claims, suits, or actions of every name, kind, and description, brought forth, or on account of, injuries to or death of any person occurring in or about the property or on account of damage to property incident to the use of, or resulting from, any and every cause occurring in or about the property which is the subject of this Lease, including any and all claims, suits, or actions for damage to vehicles on the property.

With respect to third-party claims against the Lessee, the Lessee waives any and all rights to any type of express or implied indemnity against the Lessor, its officers or employees.

It is the intent of the parties that the Lessee will indemnify, defend and hold harmless the Lessor, its officers and employees from any and all claims, suits, or actions as set forth above regardless of the existence or degree of fault or negligence on the part of the Lessor, the Lessee, the officers or employees of either of these, other than the sole negligence of the Lessor, its officers and employees.

Nothing in this lease is intended to create the public or any member thereof a third-party beneficiary hereunder, nor is any term or condition or other provision of the Lease intended to establish a standard of care owned to the public or any member thereof.

Said policies shall name the Lessor as an additional insured and shall inure to the contingent liabilities, if any, of the Lessor, and the officers, agents and employees of Lessor and shall obligate the insurance carriers to notify Lessor, in writing, not less than thirty (30) days prior to the cancellation thereof, or any other change affecting the coverage of the policies. Lessee shall furnish to Lessor either a certified copy of each and every such policy or a fully executed "CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE WITH ENDORSEMENT FOR LEASE OF STATE-OWNED PROPERTY" within not more than ten (10) days after the effective date of the policy. Lessee agrees that if Lessee does not keep such insurance in full force and effect, Lessor shall have the right to immediately terminate this lease.

NONDISCRIMINATION: The Lessee, for himself, his heirs, personal representatives, successors in interest, and assigns as a part of the consideration hereof, does hereby covenant and agree, as a covenant running with the land, that the Lessee shall maintain and operate any facilities on the land or services offered thereon in compliance with all other requirements imposed pursuant to Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Department of Transportation, Subtitle A, Office of the Secretary, Part 21, Nondiscrimination in Federally assisted programs of the Department of Transportation-Effectuation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and as said Regulations may be amended.

That in the event of breach of any of the above nondiscrimination covenants, the State of California shall have the right to terminate the lease and to re-enter and repossess said land and the facilities thereon and hold the same as if said lease had never been made or issued.

- WAIVER: If any part of this Agreement is invalid by reason of law or governmental regulation, or if any provisions hereof are waived by the Department, the remaining portions of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect. The receipt by the Department of rent with the knowledge of any breach of a provision of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of such breach.
- 24) ENCUMBRANCES: Lessee shall not encumber the leased premises in any manner whatsoever.
- ASSIGNMENT FOR BENEFIT OF CREDITORS, INSOLVENCY, OR BANKRUPTCY: Appointment of a receiver to take possession of Lessee's assets, Lessee's general assignment for benefit of creditors, or Lessee's insolvency or taking or suffering action under the Bankruptcy Act is a breach of this lease and this lease shall terminate.
- 26) POSTING OF PROPERTY: Lessor or its agents shall at all times have the right to go upon and inspect the leased property and to serve or to post thereon any notice required or permitted by law for protection of any right or interest of Lessor.
- 27) HAZARDOUS MATERIALS: Hazardous materials are those substances listed in California Code of Regulations, Title 22, Section 66261.126, Appendix X, or those which meet the toxicity, reactivity, corrosivity or flammability criteria of Article 11 of the above Code, as well as any other substance which poses a hazard to health or environment.

Except as otherwise permitted in this Lease, Lessee shall not use, create, store or allow any such substances on the premises. Fuel stored in a motor vehicle for the exclusive use in such vehicle is excepted.

In no case shall Lessee cause or allow the deposit or disposal of any such substance on the lease property.

However, household products necessary for routine cleaning and maintenance of the property may be kept on the leased premises in quantities reasonable for current needs.

Lessor, or its agents or contractors, shall at all times have the right to go upon and inspect the leased premises and the operations conducted thereon to assure compliance with the requirements herein stated. This inspection may include taking samples of substances and materials present for testing, and/or testing soils or underground tanks on the premises.

Breach of any of these covenants, terms and conditions shall give Lessor authority to immediately terminate this lease. It is the intent of the parties hereto that the Lessee shall be responsible for and beat the entire cost of removal and disposal of hazardous materials or waste introduced to the premises during Lessee's period of use and possession as owner, operator or Lessee of the property. The Lessee shall also be responsible for any cleanup and decontamination on or off the leased premises necessitated by such materials or waste.

Lessee shall further hold the State, and any officer or employee, harmless from all responsibility, liability and claim for damages resulting form the presence or use of hazardous materials on the premises during the Lessee's period of use and possession.

BREACH OF ANY OF THE ABOVE COVENANTS, TERMS, AND CONDITIONS SHALL GIVE EITHER PARTY AUTHORITY TO IMMEDIATELY TERMINATE THIS LEASE.

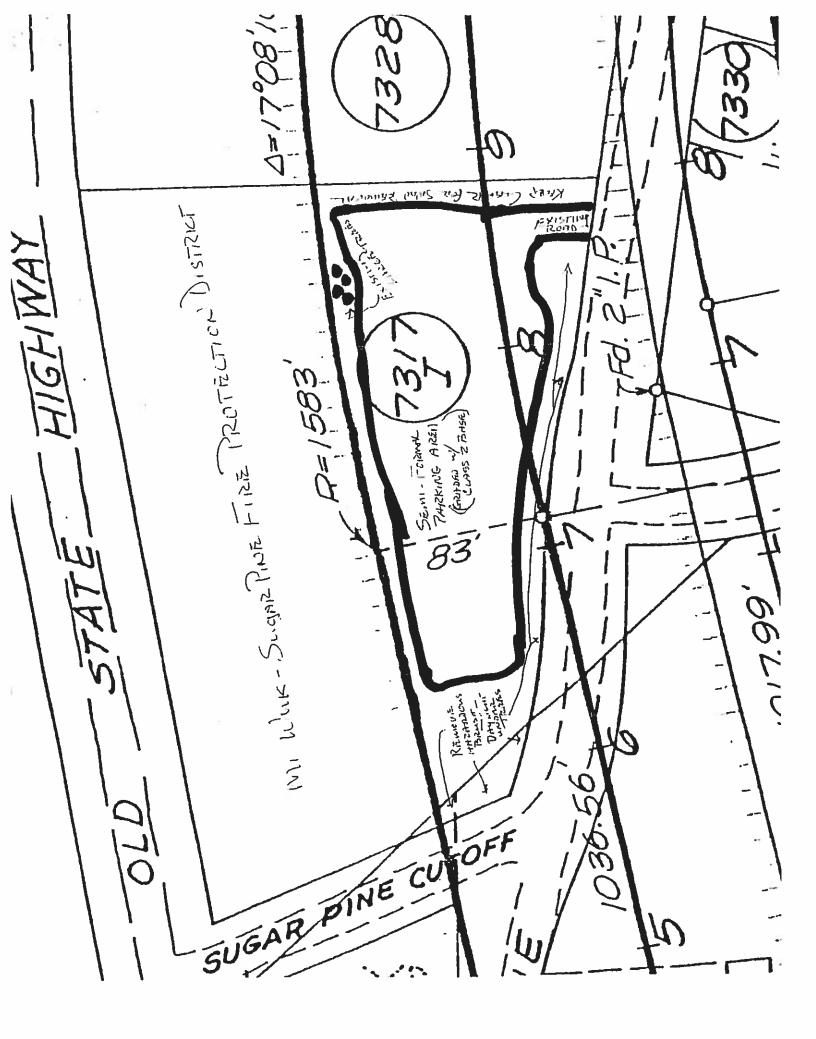
